

Alexandria Researcher: Share Lists and Results

When you find something great in Alexandria, you can share it.

Maybe the library just got this book, and you know your friend has been really wanting to read it.

Click on the book, then on the Share icon that appears. Copy the link, and you can email or message it to your friend—or post it to his blog, if he has a blog.

Maybe your sister insists there are *NO* books in the library about *frogs*. Well, you searched ‘frog’ and found plenty of results. To prove it to her, click on the Share icon at the top left, copy the URL, and send it right to her. Let her know she can create a list for them, or put them on hold!

Log in. Maybe you are doing a class project and you have a partner for the project. You’ve made a list of books that will help you with your project.

Before you can share the list, you have to make the list Public. So inside the list, click on the List icon, and choose Edit List.

Change the Sharing from Private to Public, and Save.

You might have to close the list and open it back up, then you’ll see the Share icon for the list. Click on that, and it has the link that will take your partner right to your list. They won’t be able to change your list, only see what’s there.

And if you’re looking for ideas on what to read, ask your friends to send you links to books *they* find, or to *their* lists.

Everybody loves to share, right?
