

Alexandria Researcher: Print Lists and Results

Let's say you and your friend are doing a research project on Samurai for your History class.

Before you present to the class, your teacher requires you to hand in a list of all your sources—in proper MLA format.

Guess what? You can print your Alexandria list in Citation format.

Up to the left, click on the printer icon.

Pick the type of format you want, like Citation Format, and it will show you what that's going to look like, with the citation information for each book.

There's also a Bibliographic Format, which includes the call number, and a Notes format, which has the description and space for notes.

All you need for this example is the Citation Format, so choose that again, and click on Print.

The Print screen for your browser and computer will come up, and you can print to a printer, or save as a PDF.

You may want to write your name on it, then hand that Citation information right to your teacher.
